ORDINANCE NO. 5621.

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A
PROPOSITION TO ANNEX CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRITORY DESIGNATED AS
ENCANTO AND CHOLLAS TO THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, TO THE QUALIFIED
ELECTORS RESIDING THEREIN.

WHEREAS, on the 27th day of February, 1914, a petition was filed with the Common Council, asking that the City of San Diego annex to said City certain territory described in said petition, commonly designated as Encanto and Chollas; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to the satisfaction of said Common Council that the names of one-fourth of the qualified electors residing in said territory appear signed on said petition as required by Section 2 of Chapter 312 of the Statutes and Amendments to the Codes of California, 1913, NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of said Section 2 of said Chapter 312 of the

Statutes and Amendments to the Codes of California, 1913,

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. A special election of the qualified electors of the territory herein-after described, is hereby called and proclaimed to be held in the said territory herein-after described, on the 4th day of August, A. D. 1914, at which said election there is hereby submitted to the qualified electors of said hereinafter described territory, the following proposition of the Common Council of said City, to annex to, incorporate in and made part of the City of San Diego the said territory hereinafter described.

PROPOSITION I.

Shall the City of San Diego annex to, incorporate in and make a part of the said City of San Diego the following described property, situate in the County of San Diego, State of California, to-wit:

Commencing at the southwesterly corner of the City of East San Diego, California, which is also the intersection of the northerly line of B Street, Marilou Park, according to Recorder's Map No. 517, and the easterly boundary line of Pueblo of San Diego, and being also the easterly boundary line of the City of San Diego, and running thence southeasterly along the said easterly boundary line of the City of San Diego to the southeast corner of said City of San Diego, which is also the southwesterly corner of "Part of the Rancho Mission San Diego excepted from the Partition by the Decree", according to the map of the partition of the Rancho Mission San Diego, San Diego County, California, said map being made by the referees as pursuant to an order of the Superior Court made in case number 348 entitled, Luce v Bank of Commerce et al. of San Diego, and filed in the office of the County Clerk of said county of San Diego, California; thence northeasterly along the southerly line of the Rancho Mission San Diego according to said Partition map, to the southeast corner of Lot No. 13 of said Partition of Rancho Mission San Diego; thence northerly according to said Partition map of the Rancho Mission San Diego, along the easterly line of said Lot 13 to a point on said line where the south line of Spring Valley Avenue intersects the same, said Spring Valley Avenue being as shown upon that certain map entitled, "Subdivision No. 5, in Ex Mission Lot No. 12, of the Ex Mission Rancho, San Diego County, Cal. 1893", and recorded in Book No. 2, Page 63 of Licensed Survey Maps, in the Recorder's office of San Diego County, California; thence easterly along the said south line of Spring Valley Avenue for a distance of 1698 feet; thence northerly along the easterly line of Lots numbered 57 and 58 of said subdivision No. 5, to the northeast corner of Lot No. 57; thence westerly along the north line of said Lot No. 57, and the north line of Toler's Addition to an intersection with the easterly line of Heretofore described Lot No. 13, of Rancho Mission; thence northerly along the easterly line of said Lot No. 13 to the northeast corner thereof, which is also the southeast corner of Lot No. 19 of Mission Rancho San Diego; thence westerly along the northerly line of said Lot 13 to the northwest corner thereof, which is also the southwest corner of Lot 19 of Mission Rancho San Diego, and the east boundary line of the City of East San Diego; thence southerly along the westerly boundary line of said Lot 13, also easterly boundary line of East San Diego, to corner No. 4 of said Lot 13, Rancho Mission San Diego; thence westerly along a portion of the northerly boundary line of said Lot 13, and the northerly boundary lines of Lots 18 and 17 of said Rancho Mission San Diego to the northwest corner or corner No. 4 of said Lot 17; thence southerly along the westerly boundary line of said Lot 17 about three quarters of a mile to a point on the westerly boundary line of said Lot 17, and to the southeast corner of Lot 16, according to Recorder's Map 283, same being "Map of a portion of Ex Mission Lands of San Diego, A. E. Horton, Prop'r", commonly known as Horton's Purchase of Ex Mission Lands; thence westerly along the southerly boundary line of said Lot 16 and the southerly boundary lines of Lots 17, 18, 19 and 20, according to said Recorder's Map numbered 283 of a portion of the Ex Mission Lands of San Diego, and

commonly known as Horton's Purchase, to the southwest corner of Lot 20, said southwest corner of Lot 20 being on the easterly boundary line of Marilou Park, San Diego, Cal., according to the Recorder's Map numbered 517; thence following the easterly boundary line of said Marilou Park to its intersection with the easterly prolongation of the northerly boundary line of said B Street in said Marilou Park, to its intersection with the easterly boundary line of the City of San Diego, or place of beginning;

The property above described, after such annexation, to be subject to taxation equally with the property within the City of San Diego, to pay the following bonded indebtedness of the City of San Diego, to-wit:

A bonded indebtedness of \$340,000, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, voted at a Special Election August 9th, 1910, for an addition to the Water System of the City, as provided in Ordinance No. 4152, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego and approved by the Mayor thereof on June 16th, 1910.

A bonded indebtedness of \$92,500, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, voted at a Special Election August 9th, 1910, for the extension and addition to the City's Sewer System north of Ugas Street and east of Indiana Street, as provided in Ordinance No. 4152, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, and approved by the Mayor thereof, on June 16th, 1910.

A bonded indebtedness of \$26,000, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, voted at a Special Election August 9th, 1910, for the extension and addition of the City's Sewer System north of Juniper Street to University Avenue and east of the City Park, as provided in Ordinance No. 4152, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego and approved by the Mayor thereof on June 16th, 1910.

A bonded indebtedness of \$74,500, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, voted at a Special Election August 9th, 1910, for the Extension and Addition of the City's Sewer System in portions of Arnold and Choate's Addition, Mission Hills, Horton's Addition, Palm Heights, Idylwild, Middletown, Middletown Addition, and other adjacent territory, and a gravity line of sewers to carry the sewage now handled by the ejector at Fifth Street and University Avenue, as provided in Ordinance No. 4152, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, and approved by the Mayor thereof, June 16, 1910.

A bonded indebtedness of \$1,000,000, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, voted at a Special Election August 9, 1910, for the improvement of the 1400 acre Public Park, as provided in Ordinance No. 4152, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego and approved by the Mayor thereof on June 16th, 1910.

A bonded indebtedness of \$1,000,000, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, voted at a Special Election on November 14th, 1911, for a municipal wharf and other harbor improvements, as provided in Ordinance No. 4539, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego on September 26th, 1911, and approved by the Mayor thereof on September 26th, 1911.

A bonded indebtedness of \$850,000, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum, voted at a Special Election on July 1st, 1913, for the improvement of the Fourteen Hundred (1400) Acre Public Park, known as "Balboa Park", as provided in Ordinance No. 5105, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego on May 21st, 1913, and approved by the Mayor thereof on May 22nd, 1913.

A bonded indebtedness of \$2,500,000, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, voted at a Special Election on August 15th, 1912, for the acquisition by the City of San Diego for use of said City, of water works and water rights, including lands, dams, dam-sites, reservoirs, reservoir-sites, right-of way, pipe lines, conduits, and water filtering plant, situated in the County of San Diego, California, as pro-

vided in Ordinance No. 4786, duly passed by the Common Council of the City of San Diego on July 3rd, 1912, and approved by the Mayor thereof on July 5th, 1912.

Section 2. For the purposes of this election, the territory hereinbefore described shall be referred to and designated as Encanto and Chollas.

Section 3. Said election shall be held in the district hereinbefore described and referred to herein as Encanto, and Chollas, on the 4th day of August, 1914, and the said election shall be conducted as in this ordinance and in the laws of the State of California provided.

Section 4. The ballot provided at said election shall be so printed as to state the proposition set out in Section 1 of this ordinance, in manner and form following:

"Shall the City of San Diego annex to, incorporate in and make a part of said City, the district commonly known as Encanto, and Chollas, said district assuming its legitimate portion of all obligations and taxation arising from bond issues in the City of San Diego, as set forth in Ordinance No. 4539, Ordinance No. 4786, Ordinance No. 4152 and Ordinance No. 5105, concerning Harbor, Water and Park Improvement Bonds, amounting in the aggregate to \$5,883,000.00?"	YES

In addition to the directions which the general law of the State requires to be printed on the ballot, it shall contain the following directions to the voter: "If you desire to vote for the proposition contained herein, stamp a cross (X) in the voting square at the right of, and opposite the word 'Yes', which is in the square at the right of said proposition. If you desire to vote against the proposition, stamp a cross (X) at the right of, and opposite the word 'No', which is in the square at the right of said proposition."

In respects not provided for in this ordinance, the ballot to be used at said election, as to its form, shall conform to the provisions of the General Law of the State of California touching municipal elections in such municipalities as is the City of San Diego, and in accordance with the Act of the Legislature of the State of California of 1913, entitled, "An Act to provide for the alteration of the boundaries of and for the annexation of territory to Municipal Corporations, for the incorporation of such annexed territory in and as a part thereof, and for the districting, government and municipal control of such annexed territory", approved June 11th, 1913, in effect August 10th, 1913.

Section 5. Electors voting at said election shall indicate their choice on said proposition by stamping a cross (X) in the voting square at the right of the word "Yes", or in the voting square at the right of the word "No".

If an elector shall have stamped a cross (X) in the voting square after the said printed word "Yes", his vote shall be counted in favor of said proposition; and if an elector shall have stamped a cross (X) in the voting square after the printed word "No", his vote shall be counted against said proposition.

Section 6. For the purposes of this said election, the election precincts of said Encanto and Chollas district are hereby designated as Precinct Number One, and Precinct Number Two, and are bounded and defined as follows:

Precinct Number One includes all that portion of the County of San Diego embraced within the following described boundaries: Beginning at the northeast corner of Lot 29, Horton's Purchase of Ex Mission Lands, being also on southerly line of City of East San Diego; thence running westerly along the southerly boundary line of the City of East San Diego to the easterly boundary line of the City of San Diego; thence southeasterly along said easterly boundary line to the southwest corner of Rancho Mission San Diego; thence northeast along south boundary line of said Rancho to the southeast corner of said Horton's Purchase; thence north to the point of beginning.

Precinct Number Two includes all that portion of the County of San Diego embraced

ORDINANCE NO. 7561.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PUBLIC DISPLAY OF FLAGS,
EMBLEMS OR SYMBOLS OF A TYPE APT TO INCITE PUBLIC
DISTURBANCES, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION
THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Common Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall publicly display any flag, standard or symbol emblematic of any nation, organization or doctrine which is likely to provoke a riot or breach of the peace.

Section 2. No red flag or black flag, and no banner, ensign or symbol having upon it any inscription opposed to organized government, or which may be derogatory to public morals, shall be carried in public parade on any street, or other public highway, or publicly exhibited in any licensed hall, or public place of amusement, or upon any vehicle, or upon any building or premises, or in any other manner in public within said City.

Section 3. For the preservation of the peace, and to safeguard the people against the dangers of exhibitions which lead to disorder and riot, the display in public parade, or on any street or public highway in said City, or the public display in any licensed hall or public place of amusement, or upon any vehicle, or upon any building or premises, or the public display in any other manner within said City, of the red flag or the black flag, recognized as symbols apt to incite people to transgressions of law, is hereby prohibited.

Section 4. If any section, or part thereof, of this ordinance is for any reason declared invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance. The Common Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, sentence, clause and phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, sentences, clauses or phrases is declared invalid.

Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00), nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), and by imprisonment in the City Jail of said City for a period of not less than fifteen (15) nor more than one hundred fifty (150) days, and in the event that the fine imposed herein is not paid, then by additional imprisonment in the City Jail of said City at the rate of one day for every two dollars

of the fine so imposed.

Section 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and one of urgency, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its final passage and approval.

The facts constituting the emergency, and a statement of the urgency of this ordinance, are as follows:

In numerous cities in the United States where large numbers of soldiers and sailors of American military forces are quartered, riots and public disorders and disturbances of the peace have followed the public display of flags, emblems and symbols of the general character prohibited under the terms of this ordinance. In The City of San Diego there are stationed large numbers of soldiers and sailors of American military forces, constantly present, and whose constant presence is desired, upon the streets of this municipality by the inhabitants thereof. There are also present within this municipality individuals and organizations who heretofore have displayed flags, emblems and symbols of the type in this ordinance prohibited; that said individuals and organizations have declared their intention to again publicly display said flags, emblems and symbols; that it is the belief of said Common Council that unless an ordinance be made immediately effective such threats will be carried out, and that such flags, emblems and symbols will be displayed and that riots, disturbances and disorders upon the public thoroughfares will certainly result.

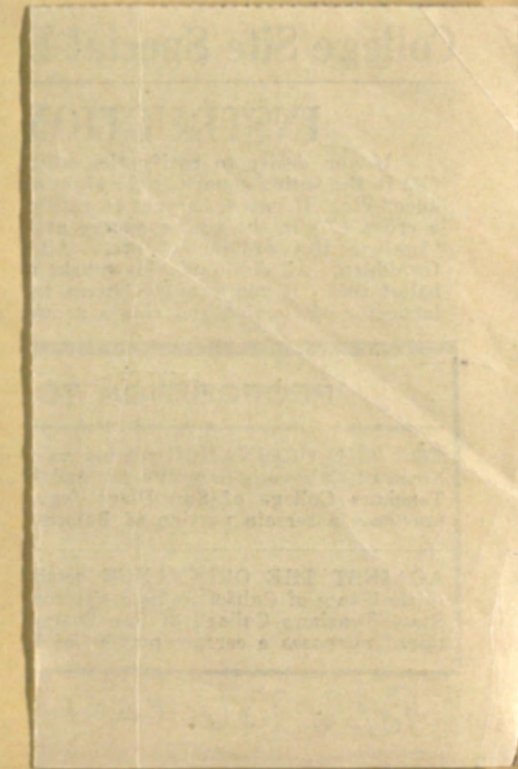

BE IT ORDAINED by the people of The City of San Diego as follows:

Section 1. From and after the date of the taking effect of this Ordinance, each Councilman of The City of San Diego shall receive as compensation for his services Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per meeting, and not more than Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) in any fiscal year.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect on the date that the same is approved by a majority of the qualified electors of The City of San Diego."

PROPOSITION.

Amend Section 27, Article V, of the Charter of The City of San Diego, so as to read as follows:

"Section 27. THE CITY MANAGER. The Council shall elect a Manager within sixty (60) days from the first meeting in May, under this Charter, who shall be the chief executive and administrative officer of the City. The Manager shall be chosen by the Council solely on the basis of his proven executive and administrative qualifications. The Manager need not, when elected, be a resident of the City or State, but must be a citizen of the United States. He shall, upon his election, immediately become a resident of the City. No member of the Council shall, during the time for which he was elected, or for one (1) year thereafter, be eligible to hold the position of Manager. The Manager shall be elected for an indefinite term, but may be removed at the pleasure of the Council; *provided, however, that the Manager shall not be removed unless five (5) members of the Council shall vote in favor of such removal.* Before the Manager may be removed he shall, if he shall so demand, be given a written statement of the reasons alleged for his removal and the right to be heard publicly thereon at a meeting of the Council prior to the final vote on the question of his removal, but pending and during such hearing the Council may suspend him from office. At least two weeks shall be given the Manager between notice and hearing for the preparation of his answer to the reasons for removal. The action of the Council in suspending or removing the Manager shall be final and conclusive on everyone, it being the intention of this Charter to vest all authority and fix all responsibility for such suspension or removal in the Council. He shall receive a salary to be fixed in the annual appropriation ordinance. The salary set in the appropriation ordinance shall not be reduced while the Manager holds office, but may be subject to increase by the Council at its discretion. The Manager shall designate one of his subordinates as Assistant Manager, who shall serve as Manager in case of the absence or disability of the Manager.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of City Manager, the Council shall fill the same within sixty (60) days after the vacancy occurs; *provided, however, that it shall require the affirmative vote of five (5) members of the Council to elect a person to the office of Manager.*"

PROPOSITION I. Amend Section 23 of Article III of the City Charter.

This amendment provides a complete procedure for the exercise of the initiative, referendum and recall; it provides that 5% of the qualified electors of The City of San Diego may initiate any ordinance or legislative, administrative or executive action which the Council itself might adopt; that when such a petition is signed by 15% of the qualified electors of the City, then the Council must call a special election for the submission thereof to the people, but that if such initiative petition contains the names of at least 5% and less than 15%, the Council shall submit the same at the next general municipal election or at the next election at which all of the qualified electors of the City are entitled to vote; that for the referendum a petition presented within 30 days after the adoption by the Council of any ordinance, order or resolution as limited and referred to in said amendment, signed by at least 7% of the qualified electors of the City, shall temporarily suspend the taking effect thereof; that when such a referendary petition is signed by 15% of the qualified electors of the City, then the Council must call a special election for the submission thereof, but that if such petition contains the names of at least 7% and less than 15% of the qualified electors, the Council shall submit the same at the next general municipal election or at the next election at which all the qualified voters of the City are entitled to vote; that for the recall of any elective official of The City of San Diego it requires a petition signed by at least 25% of the qualified electors of said City, and that thereupon the Council shall, by ordinance, order the holding of a special election for the purpose of submitting the question of such recall and the election of a successor. All of the percentages for the filing of the petitions specified in this amendment are based upon the total number of votes cast for all candidates for the office of Mayor at the last general municipal election or primary election at which a Mayor was elected, prior to the filing of said petition. Further detailed particulars are contained in Resolution No. 65400, filed in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 301055.

PROPOSITION II. Amend Sections 103, 104 and 105 of Article VII of the Charter of The City of San Diego.

(a) Section 103. This amendment empowers the City to acquire, own and operate public utilities; to grant franchises for the use of public property of the City only on condition that each grant contain reservations permitting electors to amend, modify or repeal; permitting condemnation by City of property of franchise grantee used and useful in the public service without payment for good will, going concern value, earning power, increased cost of reproduction, severance damage, or increased value of property occupied by plant; permitting change of grade or alignment of streets by City without liability; limiting terms to not more than 50 years, and prohibiting exclusive grants; requiring public utilities to pay the City for costs of all investigations initiated by complaint of the City whenever upon such investigations being made by the Railroad Commission the rates charged and practices performed are unreasonable, unjust, excessive or discriminatory.

(b) Section 104. This amendment prescribes the procedure for granting franchises for the use of public property after application, payment by applicant of costs of proceedings, recommendation of City Manager, publication of notice of intention to grant, requiring payment to City of not less than 2% of annual gross receipts arising from use, operation and maintenance of franchise, providing bond for faithful performance, providing for forfeiture for failure to perform, requiring a two-thirds vote on ordinance making grant, subjecting ordinance granting franchise to right of referendum, requiring Manager to keep public record of all grants.

(c) Section 105. This amendment subjects all franchises to right of City to repeal same at any time for misuse, nonuse, failure to begin construction within time prescribed, or otherwise comply with terms; reserves right to examine accounts and records of any franchise holder, require reports and impose regulations for health, safety and welfare of public; requires owner of street or interurban franchise to maintain portions of streets occupied by its tracks in good repair, flush with street and with good crossings; and to lay suitable foundations for tracks when new paving is put down by the City.

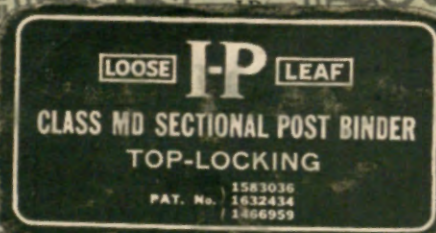
