TO THE HONORABLE, THE MAYOR AND THE COMMON COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA.

Gentlemen:

I wish to bring to your attention what appears to be a violation of the building ordinances of the City of San Diego.

A stable has been constructed at 357 Second Street which was built without first obtaining a permit; which is of wooden construction and is within the fire limits; in which no precaution has been taken to rat-proof the building or to take care of the manure, animal excreta or stable refuse.

Each of these omissions constitutes a violation of the building ordinance.

We have taken this matter up with the City Attorney's office and are advised that before any steps are taken to arbitrarily remove the building a hearing should be held by the Common Council to determine whether or not a nuisance exists, as alleged.

I would therefore, respectfully request your Honorable Body to order the owner to appear and show cause why this building should not be declared a public nuisance and ordered removed.
