To the Honorable, the Mayor and Council,
of The City of San Diego, California.

Re: Poultry Farm at 4121 Kansas Street

Gentlemen:

Animals and domestic fowl may be kept within 15 feet of any adjacent building used or occupied for dwelling purposes. Ordinance No. 3063 of the ordinances of The City of San Diego provides in Section 1 thereof as follows:

"Section 1. It is hereby declared that it shall be unlawful for any person to keep any cow, goat, sheep, chicken, duck, goose, turkey, pigeon, or other domestic fowl in any enclosure of any kind, located within less than fifteen feet of any adjacent building used or occupied for residence purposes within the city limits of San Diego."

Should an insanitary condition exist because of the maintenance of such poultry farm, such fact should be called to the attention of the Department of Public Health.

It is the duty of the District Attorney to prosecute all cases amounting to a public nuisance (Penal Code 373a) and the facts in this case should be laid before him.
