Dear Ladies:

My Father, Mr. Fred Scripps, has asked me to reply to your resolution pertaining to his cows and barnyard fowls.

I am enclosing a copy of the letter sent to Mr. Thomas Whelan, District Attorney, after my Father had complied with the suggestions made by him.

Permit me to give some of the history of this barnyard in question:

My Father moved to Pacific Beach in 1900 and settled in the place where he now lives. He set up a more or less self supporting establishment because of the isolated position he found himself in at that time. Among other things he elected to keep cows, horses, chickens and other fowls and has continued to do so up to this time. However, within the last six years, to eliminate as far as possible any objections, inconveniences or disturbances to any one in the neighborhood he went to considerable expense in shifting the barn around to the west of the corral, whereas they used to be on the east side which exposed the corral to the west and Mission Beach. He has planted and maintained acacia trees along the whole of the west line of the property so that from a looks standpoint it would fair favorably with anything in Mission Beach adjoining. The barnyard area adjoins a Zone C section of Mission Beach.

The man who takes care of the barnyard property has been charged with the proper instructions and responsibility of keeping the premises as clean as practical at all times.

We understand that it is perfectly permissible to keep such an establishment as my Father has under the conditions that he is attempting to maintain same.
