Pursuant to your request for a report on the condition of building and premises used to stable horses at Swift Street and University Ave., San Diego, beg leave to report as follows:


The P.M. Dairy, owners of said building, have willingly complied with all requirements of the present stable ordinance, and are keeping stable and premises as clean and sanitary as it is possible to keep them.

This equipment will not be renewed so it is but a matter of time until this condition will be automatically eliminated.

At present there is no great number of residences affected by either flies or odor.

It is not a public nuisance and it is not incumbent upon the Health Department to abate as such.
